Dear Hadassah International Colleagues,



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HADASSAH INTERNATIONAL PROGRAM

TUESDAY, 16 OCTOBER

Arrive in Jerusalem to begin a most inspiring centennial celebration. Check in to the Mamilla Hotel or the Prima Kings Hotel.

Morning: For those who arrive early, you are invited to participate as we march, sing, dance and cheer through the streets of downtown Jerusalem. We will follow the torch that was relayed from Israel through communities around the United States and brought home to Jerusalem. Hadassah International participants will carry their countries' flags, as we make this gathering a truly International festival. Get ready to celebrate with a Flash Mob Dance and official opening ceremonies at Safra Square.

Afternoon: Explore the Israel Museum, with a focus on the Judaica exhibits and the special exhibitions currently on display. The Jack, Joseph, and Morton Mandel Wing for Jewish Art and Life presents the religious artwork of Jewish communities worldwide, with works dating from the Middle Ages up to present times.

Early Evening: Gather with your Hadassah International colleagues from around the world for a festive buffet dinner at the Mamilla Hotel.

Evening: Join all Hadassah delegates at the Israel Convention Center for a joyous dedication of the Sarah Wetsman Davidson Hospital Tower, Hadassah's Centennial gift to the people of Israel.

WEDNESDAY, 17 OCTOBER

Morning: See, touch and feel the pulse of the Sarah Wetsman Davidson Hospital Tower as you tour this incredible 19-story building which will transform the future of medicine in Jerusalem. Join us as we honor our international donors who have contributed at the Founders level of \$25,000 or more to the Tower at a special dedication ceremony on the Hadassah Hospital-Ein Kerem campus.

Afternoon: Learn about the Six-Day War in 1967 as we visit Ammunition Hill, a site of intense battles that now serves as a living memorial to those who gave their lives in defense of the country. Box lunches will be provided.

Evening: Founders Dinner for those who have donated a gift at the Centennial Founder level of \$25,000 or higher. (By invitation.) Or enjoy a free evening in this magical city.

THURSDAY, 18 OCTOBER

Morning: Our day begins with a tour of Hadassah International's special projects at Hadassah Hospital-Mount Scopus, where we will experience the impact of our partnership with the Medical Center. The tour will be followed by our Hadassah International Business Meeting and Lunch.

Afternoon Optional Track 1: Discover the wonders of ancient Jerusalem, beginning with a visit to the Davidson Center, where multimedia exhibitions detail the history and construction of the Temple Mount area.

Afternoon Optional Track 2: Tour the Menachem Begin Center, where interactive multimedia exhibitions detail the life of Menachem Begin and the history of the State of Israel.

Late Afternoon: Gala Centennial Celebration Event at Latrun, Israel's Army Corps historic site. Experience a Shouk (market), Hadassah style, as you sample a wide array of food, which will all be available for purchase. Music, dancing, entertainment and a fabulous program will culminate Hadassah's first 100 years and begin our second century.

Each person registering must complete a registration form and send it to Ayelet Tours by email, fax or regular mail. A \$500 deposit per person is required to confirm your reservation.

BUSINESS AND FIRST CLASS UPGRADES

Flying First or Business Class is comfortable, but considerably more costly. Despite this, these premium seats on all airlines are desirable and sell quickly. Ayelet Tours will make reservations for you on a first come, first served basis. We strongly recommend reserving early.

TRANSFERS

Group transportation to and from Ben Gurion Airport on 16 and 19 October for Convention, and for the days of arrival and departure for pre and post tours, will be provided. Transfers on other dates are available from Ayelet Tours at an additional charge.

GENERAL INFORMATION

MAMILLA HOTEL

Mamilla Hotel, the newest of luxury Jerusalem hotels, brings world-class superior design and lifestyle hospitality to Jerusalem and Israel. Located in the heart of Jerusalem alongside the new shopping and entertainment experience, the Alrov Mamilla Avenue, guests can enjoy magnificent views of the Old City walls, the Tower of David, and Jaffa Gate. Guests will enjoy exceptional accommodations together with exclusive restaurant and bar venues, a Holistic Wellbeing Center, as well as events and banqueting spaces, that blend sophistication and modern international style with the unique and rich culture of Jerusalem.

The Convention package includes contemporary standard room accommodations. Upgraded rooms and suites may be available: please check with Ayelet Tours. Most guest rooms are small and not suitable for triples. Should you wish a triple, please check with Ayelet Tours, as availability may be limited. Rooms with king size beds are also limited. Wi Fi is available for a fee.

PRIMA KINGS HOTEL

Prima Kings has been a landmark in the charming Rehavia district for three decades, catering to religious pilgrims and secular visitors alike. The hotel was recently restored in typical Jerusalem style, with a lovely lobby providing a view of both modern and traditional Jerusalem and offering a soothing and calm atmosphere, conversation nooks, and writing tables. Room amenities include a shower/bathtub, personal safe, hair dryer, cable TV with remote, telephone with international direct access dialing, coffee/tea making facilities and air conditioning. The hotel features a dining room, coffee shop, and synagogue. Wi Fi is available for a fee

ROOMMATES

Participants who would like to be paired with another delegate should make this request to Ayelet Tours. They will do their best to find a roommate with the same land package, but there is no guarantee that one will be found. If a roommate is not located by the participant or Ayelet Tours, the participant will be responsible for the additional charge for a single. Should a roommate cancel or prove to be unacceptable, single supplements will apply.

SINGLE ROOMS

A limited number of single rooms are available for an additional charge. They will be reserved on a first come, first served basis.

MEALS

All land packages include a full Israeli breakfast each day, one lavish buffet dinner and one lunch. All meals are kosher in Israel. Meals in Jordan are dairy. Lists for a wide variety of restaurants will be available from tour hostesses at each hotel. Please let us know if you have special dietary requirements in advance of the Convention.

SHABBAT

All Hadassah pre- and post- extensions observe Shabbat. Your tour guide and hostess will have addresses of synagogues and suggestions for Shabbat activities.

GRATUITIES

\$75 per person will be pre- collected for tips to your guide, bus driver, wait staff and baggage handlers.

SPECIAL NEEDS

There may be some extensive walking; you must note any difficulty walking on the registration form. Wheelchairs are available by prior request. Should you require a wheelchair for even a part of the program, you must make your own arrangements for someone to help you. Guides, bus drivers and hostesses will not be available for wheelchair assistance with the exception of loading and unloading the wheelchair on and off the bus. Should you need a wheelchair, they must be reserved in advance. The cost for renting a wheelchair is \$50 for the duration of the time in Israel. Electric carts can be rented by prior request. However, they cannot be accommodated on the buses. Ayelet Tours can arrange for a private van with a hydraulic lift and furnish prices upon request.

GENERAL INFORMATION

DEPOSITS AND PAYMENTS

Deposits of \$500 per person are required for registration. The balance for the amount due must be paid at least 60 (sixty) days prior to departure. Deposits and payments may be made by check or credit card.

CANCELLATIONS

Cancellations for Convention or pre- and post tours must be made in writing. Penalties, which are deducted from the deposit, are as follows:

From the time of booking until 60 days before departure	\$100 fee

Day 1:

Transfer to the airport in Tel Aviv for short flight to Eilat, where we will transfer to hotel for check-in. Enjoy the afternoon and evening at leisure, with time to relax on the Eilat beaches or explore the city on your own. Dinner and overnight in Eilat.

Day 2:

Enjoy a full day tour to Petra, Jordan, the Red Rose City. Either walk to the site or take a mule and ride through the dramatic "Siq" or canyon. See the Treasury and continue past the Roman Theatre, the Corinthian Tomb and Palace Tomb to the Roman Road. Return to Eilat. Dinner on your own in this great resort city. Overnight in Eilat.

Day 3:

10 - 13 October 2012 (T 101)

21 - 24 October 2012 (T 211)

Day 1:

Depart Israel for Jordan. Cross at the Sheik Hussein Crossing. Drive to Jerash, a well-preserved Greco – Roman city. Visit the Temples of Artemis and Zeus, the Roman Forum, Hadrian's Arch and the mile-long Street of Columns. Dinner and overnight in Amman.

Day 2:

Drive to Madaba to see the ancient mosaic map of the Holy Land and ancient ruins. Continue to Mt. Nebo, from which Moses viewed the Promised Land, with panoramic views of the Jordan Valley, Jericho, the Dead Sea and more. Visit the remains of a Byzantine church with its beautiful mosaics. Proceed via the Shobak (Crusader's Castle) to Wadi Moussa. Dinner and overnight in Petra.

Day 3:

Leave the hotel and travel south on the road to Petra. View the "Siq" (canyon) and learn about this ancient capital of the Nabateans from the third century BCE through the second century AD. Visit the most interesting monuments, such as the Treasury, El Khazneh (a tomb of a Nabatean king), the Field of Tombs. At Al Madhbah (the altar) we take in a view of the entire city. Return to Wadi Moussa and drive back to Amman for dinner and overnight.

Day 4:

Depart our hotel for Jerusalem or the airport for your flight home.

Travel north along Israel's Coastal Highway to Atlit, where we discover the newly expanded detention camp that was constructed by the British Mandate at the end of the 1930s as a military camp on the Mediterranean coast. Arrive at the Carmel Forest Spa with time to relax and refresh before joining together for Shabbat dinner this evening. Overnight at the Carmel Forest Spa.

Day 2:

Enjoy a full day at leisure to enjoy the Spa amenities and hotel activities. Overnight at the Carmel Forest Spa.

Day 3:

Enjoy a visit to Haifa's Mount Carmel, where we take in the beautiful views of the Bahai Temple and Gardens. Continue to a local Druze village, where we meet with members of the community to learn about their culture and history. Return to Spa for the remainder of the day at leisure. Overnight at the Carmel Forest Spa.

Day 4:

Depart from the Spa and return to Jerusalem or to the airport for your flight home.

12 - 15 October 2012 (T 104)

19 - 22 October 2012 (T 203)

Day 1:

Begin with a visit to the Palmach Museum, where we "join up" with the paramilitary fighting forces from Israel's pre-statehood days. Continue to the Rabin Museum, where we find fascinating documentation of the State of Israel's history, interwoven with the story of the slain Prime Minister's life. Time to freshen up and relax at our hotel before joining together for Shabbat dinner this evening. Overnight in Tel Aviv.

Day 2:

Shabbat Shalom! Enjoy the morning at leisure. This afternoon we enjoy a walking tour, led by a guide/actor, through the charming Neve Tzedek neighborhood. We learn about the early history of Tel Aviv and discover the many artist galleries and boutique shops that populate the neighborhood. This evening we enjoy dinner at one of the great Tel Aviv restaurants and an optional concert. Overnight in Tel Aviv.

Day 3:

Visit the newly renovated Diaspora Museum, where we learn about the diverse history of Jewish cultures and communities throughout the world. Continue to Beit Ha'ir (Town Hall) in the Bialik Complex, part of the UNESCO Heritage area known as the "White City". Beit Ha'ir serves as a lively center for exhibitions and information about Tel Aviv's history. Bialik House, known as Beit Bialik in Hebrew, was the home of poet Chaim Nachman Bialik, from 1925 to 1933. The house is now a museum featuring Bialik's works, including an exhibit of all his books, with translations into 28 languages. This afternoon we visit Old Jaffa, where we meet and talk with local artists in their galleries. This evening we enjoy dinner and a performance at the Na Laga'at Theater, home to the Deaf-Blind Acting Ensemble. Overnight in Tel Aviv.

Day 4:

Visit the Eretz Israel Museum, where we view the Mosaic Square and Yael Garden, as well as the historic exhibitions on display. Depart Tel Aviv and visit Neot Kedumim, the Biblical Landscape Reserve, where we view the unique re-creation of the physical landscape of the Bible and enjoy lunch in these beautiful surroundings. Continue to Jerusalem or the airport for your flight home.

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Travel Warning

ISRAEL, THE WEST BANK AND GAZA

August 10, 2010

The Department of State warns U.S. citizens of the risks of traveling to Israel, the West Bank, and the Gaza Strip, and about threats to themselves and to U.S. interests in those locations. The Department of State urges U.S. citizens to remain mindful of security factors when planning travel to Israel and the West Bank and to avoid all travel to the Gaza Strip. This replaces the Travel Warning issued August 5, 2010, to update information on the general security environment in Israel, the West Bank, and the Gaza Strip.

The Gaza Strip and Southern Israel

The State Department strongly urges that U.S. citizens refrain from all travel to the Gaza Strip. This recommendation applies to all U.S. citizens, including journalists and aid workers. U.S. citizens should be aware that as a consequence of a longstanding prohibition on travel by U.S. government employees into the Gaza Strip, the ability of consular staff to offer timely assistance to U.S. citizens there is extremely limited.

The Israel Defense Forces (IDF) strictly controls the crossing points between Israel and the Gaza Strip, and has essentially sealed the border. The security environment within Gaza and along its borders, including its border with Egypt and its seacoast, is dangerous and volatile. U.S. citizens are advised against traveling to Gaza by any means, including via sea. Previous attempts to enter Gaza by sea have been stopped by Israeli naval vessels and resulted in the injury, death, arrest, and deportation of U.S. citizens. From December 27, 2008, through January 17, 2009, the IDF conducted a major military operation in Gaza. Israel and Hamas, a State Department-designated foreign terrorist organization that violently seized power in Gaza in June 2007, declared separate truces to end the fighting. Occasional small clashes continue to occur along the border. Rockets and mortars are still occasionally fired into Israel from Gaza, and the IDF continues to conduct military operations inside Gaza, including airstrikes. The IDF has also declared an exclusion zone inside Gaza along the border with Israel and has taken lethal measures against individuals who enter it.

In the past, some rockets have travelled more than 40 km (24 miles) from Gaza and landed as far north as Yavne and Gadera and as far east as Beersheva. As a result of possible IDF military operations in Gaza and the ever-present risk of rocket and mortar attacks into Israel from Gaza, U.S. government personnel travelling in the vicinity of the Gaza Strip border, to include the city of Sderot, require approval from the Embassy's Regional Security Office. U.S. citizens in the area should be aware of the risks and should follow the advice of the Government of Israel's office of Homefront Command, at: <http://www.oref.org.il/315-en/PAKAR.aspx>.

The West Bank

The Department of State urges U.S. citizens to exercise caution when traveling to the West Bank. Palestinian Authority (PA) security forces are now deployed throughout the West Bank, including all major cities. As a result, violence in recent years has decreased markedly throughout the West Bank. Nonetheless, demonstrations and violent incidents can occur without warning. Vehicles have also been the target of rocks, Molotov cocktails and gunfire on West Bank roads. The IDF continues to carry out security operations in the West Bank. Israeli security operations, including incursions into Palestinian population centers, can occur at any time and lead to disturbances and violence. U.S. citizens can be caught in the middle of potentially dangerous situations. Some

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U.S. citizens involved in demonstrations in the West Bank have sustained serious injuries in confrontations with Israeli settlers and the Israel Defense Forces (IDF). The State Department recommends that U.S. citizens, for their own safety, avoid demonstrations.

During periods of unrest, the Israeli government sometimes closes off access to the West Bank and those areas may be placed under curfew. All persons in areas under curfew should remain indoors to avoid risking arrest or injury. U.S. citizens have been killed, seriously injured, or detained and deported as a result of encounters with IDF operations in Gaza and the West Bank. Travel restrictions may be imposed by Israel with little or no warning. Strict measures have frequently been imposed following terrorist actions, and the movement of Palestinian Americans, both those with residency status in the West Bank or Gaza as well as foreign passport holders, has been severely impeded. Current security-related restrictions on travel by U.S. government employees to the West Bank hinder the ability of consular staff to offer timely assistance to U.S. citizens.

Jerusalem

The State Department urges U.S. citizens to remain vigilant while traveling throughout Jerusalem, especially within the commercial and downtown areas of West Jerusalem and the city center. Spontaneous or planned protests within the Old City are possible, especially after Friday prayers. Some of these protests have led to violent clashes. Travelers should exercise caution at religious sites on holy days, Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays. Isolated street protests and demonstrations can also occur in areas of East Jerusalem, including around Salah Ed-Din Street, Damascus Gate, Silwan and the Sheikh Jarrah neighborhood. U.S. government employees are authorized to visit the Old City during daylight hours only except between the hours of 11:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. on Fridays. The area of the ramparts on the city wall between Herod's Gate and Lion's Gate is off-limits to U.S. Government personnel at all times. The Sherover or Haas Promenade (scenic overlook) located in Armon Hanatziv is open to U.S. government personnel during daylight hours only.

Travel Restrictions for U.S. Government Personnel

Personal travel in the West Bank for U.S. government personnel and their families is allowed for limited mission-approved purposes in the areas described below. They may travel to Jericho, or to transit through the West Bank using Routes 1 and 90 to reach the Allenby/King Hussein Bridge, or the Dead Sea coast near Ein Gedi and Masada. They may also travel north on Route 90 from the Allenby/King Hussein Bridge to the Sea of Galilee. Use of these routes is approved for transit purposes during daylight hours, with stops permitted only at Qumran National Park off Route 90 by the Dead Sea. Each transit requires prior notification to the Consulate General's security office.

U.S. Government personnel and family members are permitted both official and personal travel on Route 443 between Modi'in and Jerusalem without prior notification, during daylight hours only. All other personal travel in the West Bank, unless specifically authorized for mission-approved purposes, is prohibited.

General Safety and Security

Israeli authorities remain concerned about the continuing threat of terrorist attacks. U.S. citizens are cautioned that a greater danger may exist around restaurants, businesses, and other places associated with U.S. interests and/or located near U.S. official buildings, such as the U.S. Embassy in Tel Aviv and the U.S. Consulate General in Jerusalem. U.S. citizens are also urged to exercise a high degree of caution and to use common sense when patronizing restaurants, nightclubs, cafes, malls, places of worship, and theaters, especially during peak hours.

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Large crowds and public gatherings have been targeted by terrorists in the past and should be avoided to the extent practicable. U.S. citizens should take into consideration that public buses, and their respective terminals are “off-limits” to U.S. government personnel. U.S. government personnel have been directed to avoid protests and demonstrations. Personnel have also been urged to maintain a high level of vigilance and situational awareness at all times.

In the Golan Heights, there are live landmines in many areas and visitors should walk only on established roads or trails.

Entry/Exit Difficulties

U.S. citizens in Israel, the West Bank, and the Gaza Strip are strongly encouraged to register with the Consular Sections of the U.S. Embassy in Tel Aviv or the U.S. Consulate General in Jerusalem through the State Department’s travel registration website, <https://travelregistration.state.gov>. Occasional warden messages issued by the Embassy and the Consulate General are e-mailed to registered U.S. citizens and are posted on State Department websites to highlight time-sensitive security concerns.
